64:30:02:04.01. VIN requirements for trailers. Persons manufacturing trailers shall obtain and attach a 17-digit vehicle identification number on each trailer produced. For these trailers and any other trailer which weighs under ~~2,000~~ 3,000 pounds and has no trailer identification number, county treasurers may assign an identification number from the trailer identification numbers assigned to their county by the department. The

applicant must stamp the number into the trailer frame and then obtain verification from a law enforcement officer that the correct number has been imprinted onto the trailer.

For trailers which weigh ~~2,000~~ 3,000 pounds or more, application for an identification number shall be made directly to the Division of Motor Vehicles. The trailer must be inspected by an officer of the Highway Patrol's vehicle theft unit who shall attach the trailer identification number plate upon the successful completion of the inspection.
